Poverty, unemployment, lack of opportunities, local entrepreneurial environment, and debt from agriculture force many to seek jobs in the Gulf countries. This context talks about the Symposium on Telangana and Gulf Migration hosted on the 22nd of September by Dr. Srinivas Junuguru.

Most Indians, especially from Telangana, migrate to the Gulf countries to make ends meet. Yes, this was a good impact on earning but the negative side comes up when the migrants are physically absent from his/her loved ones, which Dr. Naresh had mentioned as there isn't any specific Policy made for migrants of India, It made the agents easier to loot a heap of Capitals from these diligent beings. The apathy of the government is a crucial drawback despite multiple organizations that came forward to represent the migrants namely the Emigrants Welfare Forum in Hyderabad whose President Mr. Bheem Reddy Mandha was present among us. He had given an in-depth feature, on How the government presents us, Justice, to our headline.

Workers employed in the low-skilled, labor-intensive sectors suffer malpractices such as

wage-related abuse, working overtime without compensation, and lack of social security cover and lack of protection during recruitment and employment. This points to the vulnerable position of these migrant workers which was heightened further during the COVID-19 crisis. Dr. Satya Prasad, the Dean of School Humanities and Liberal Arts gave us his insights on how the workers are exploited in the Gulf countries by the agents and that they have no other option but to do what they were presented with. The points put forward by Dr. Santosh and Dr. Naresh were promising regarding the policies that needed to be taken hold of for the welfare of the migrants such as loan options for the migrant needs, specific policies for the Migrants, and many more. Dr. Satya Prasad rightly draws attention to the role of the Indian Embassy in each country to play a part in the Migrant issues.

Towards the end, Dr. Srinivas and all the panelists picked up to initiate research and produce a policy paper regarding Migration from Telangana. Which is a great step in contributing to this issue from our end.
