Woxsen University, Hyderabad, and the University of Creative Arts (UCA), London jointly explored Gender & Gesture through a photography competition. This collaboration aimed to highlight diverse approaches, prompting reflections on the universality of gestures and connections between gender, class, and cultural identity.

The exhibition unfolded across Woxsen University and IIT Hyderabad, involving core committee members and an advisory board. Dr. Caroline Molloy and esteemed figures inaugurated the exhibitions, announced winners, and delivered talks on Gender and Performance in Studio Photography.

Building on the success of 2024, Gender and Gesture: Thinking Photography Beyond the Visual 2025 explores gender representation within global geo-political complexities. This interdisciplinary platform examines evolving gender narratives, including LGBTQ+ representation, and the critical intersection of climate and gender in an inclusive world.

Through photography, artists, academics, and professionals push the boundaries of visual storytelling, interrogating how gestures and representation intersect with social, cultural, and environmental dynamics.

- > To emphasize the power of visual storytelling in driving cultural, social, and environmental change.




